A bill to be entitled

An act relating to standards of conduct; providing a short title; amending s. 838.022, F.S.; providing that it is a third-degree felony for a public servant, with corrupt intent, to willfully fail to disclose certain direct or indirect financial interests or benefits; defining the term "with corrupt intent"; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 2. Section 838.022, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

838.022 Official misconduct.-

- (1) It is unlawful for a public servant, with corrupt intent to obtain a benefit for any person or to cause harm to another, to:
- (a) Falsify, or cause another person to falsify, any official record or official document;
- (b) Conceal, cover up, destroy, mutilate, or alter any official record or official document or cause another person to perform such an act; or
- (c) Obstruct, delay, or prevent the communication of information relating to the commission of a felony that directly involves or affects the public agency or public entity served by the public servant.
 - (2) It is unlawful for a public servant, with corrupt

intent, in a matter falling within the public servant's duties, to willfully fail to disclose:

- (a) A direct or indirect financial interest, or future financial interest, of the public servant or any member of his or her immediate family; or
- (b) Any direct or indirect benefit, or future benefit, inuring to the public servant or any member of his or her immediate family.
 - (3) (3) (2) For the purposes of this section:
- (a) The term "public servant" does not include a candidate who does not otherwise qualify as a public servant.
- (b) The term "with corrupt intent" means acting knowingly and dishonestly for a wrongful purpose.
- (c) (b) An official record or official document includes only public records.
- $\underline{(4)}$ (3) Any person who violates this section commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
