- (1) For purposes of this section:
- (a) "Commercial mobile radio service" has the same meaning as in 47 C.F.R. s. 20.3.
- (b) "Mobile telecommunications device" means a wireless telephone or other device used to access the services of a commercial mobile radio service for the purpose of sending or receiving voice, text, or other data, including, but not limited to, computer data, electronic mail, electronic messages, games, music, images, and video. The term "mobile telecommunications device" includes, but is not limited to, a cellular telephone, cellular telephone accessory device, computer, game machine, personal digital assistant, and text messaging device but does not include a pager as defined in 47 C.F.R. s. 22.99.
- (2) (a) A person who is driving or in actual physical control of a public or nonpublic school bus shall not use any mobile telecommunications device.
  - (b) This subsection does not apply:
- 1. When the school bus is stopped and the engine is not running or when the school bus is stopped completely outside the normal flow of traffic; or
- 2. When the person who is driving or in actual physical control of the school bus is using the device to contact one of the following regarding an emergency situation:
  - a. A school administrator.
  - b. A law enforcement agency.
  - c. A firefighting service.
  - d. An emergency communications E911 system service.
    - e. A hospital or emergency rescue service.
