An act relating to HIV testing; creating s. 384.311, F.S.; requiring HIV testing to be offered as a routine part of a patient's annual physical examination; requiring a health care provider to provide the patient with certain information concerning HIV testing; providing definitions; requiring the Department of Health to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 384.311, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

384.311 HIV testing as a routine part of an annual physical exam; duty of health care provider.—

(1) Every health care provider, including every physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459, shall offer an HIV test as a routine part of an annual physical examination of a patient as specified by department rule. Testing shall be performed by a laboratory approved for such purposes under part I of chapter 483.

(2) A health care provider shall inform the patient that the HIV test is planned, provide information about the test, and inform the patient that there are numerous treatment options available for a patient who tests positive for the presence of the antibody or antigen to the human immunodeficiency virus. The health care provider shall also inform the patient that a person who tests negative should continue to be routinely tested. The

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health care provider shall advise the patient that he or she has the right to decline the test. If the patient objects to testing, a written statement of objection, signed by the patient, shall be placed in the patient's medical record.

- (3) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Health care provider" means a person who is licensed in this state and who, as part of his or her scope of practice, performs physical examinations and orders, performs, or administers HIV testing.
- (b) "HIV test" means a test ordered to determine the presence of the antibody or antigen to human immunodeficiency virus or the presence of human immunodeficiency virus infection.
- $\underline{\mbox{(4)}}$ The department shall adopt rules to administer this section.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
