A bill to be entitled

An act relating to school-based AIDS education; requiring the Department of Education to award grants to public school districts to implement school-based AIDS educational activities; providing for the grant awards to be made from funds appropriated by the Legislature; specifying requirements for grant proposals by school districts; requiring that the department consider specified factors in awarding grants; requiring each school district that receives a grant to file an annual report with the department; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. School-based AIDS education incentive grants.—
- (1) Beginning with the 2010-2011 school year, from funds appropriated by the Legislature for this purpose, the Department of Education shall award grants on a competitive basis to public school districts wishing to implement AIDS education activities pursuant to this section. The grants shall be awarded annually by October 1 of each year.
- (2) A school district may apply for a school-based AIDS education incentive grant by submitting a grant proposal to the department by August 1 of each year on forms prescribed by the department. In order to be considered for funding, the grant proposal must include:
- (a) A detailed description of the program to be implemented, including a statement of program objectives,

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activities, target population, and number of students to be served, and an identification of all education programs, community agencies, private-sector entities, and other personnel and resources involved in program development and implementation;

- (b) Assurance that parents and guardians will be involved in the development and implementation of the program;
 - (c) A detailed program budget; and
- (d) Measures for evaluating the effectiveness of the program, including outcomes.
- (3) The department shall consider the following factors in awarding grants under this section:
- (a) The HIV/AIDS, STD, and teenage pregnancy rates within the geographic area to be served by the program. Those geographic areas that have high HIV/AIDS, STD, or teenage pregnancy rates shall have priority for selection.
- (b) The qualifications and training of personnel who will be responsible for program administration and classroom implementation.
- (c) The extent to which the program will be coordinated with the existing school comprehensive health education program.
 - (d) The potential effectiveness of the program.
- (e) The degree to which the program's objectives and activities are consistent with the goals of this section.
- (4) The department shall make available to each school district applying for a school-based AIDS education incentive grant information concerning all of the criteria used by the department in selecting the proposals for funding.
 - (5) Each school district that is awarded a grant under this
