House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to strengthen and make permanent the research and development tax credit.

WHEREAS, research and development is a vital economic component in the 21st century, generating ideas and technologies that encourage productivity and economic growth, and

WHEREAS, research and development keeps this country's companies on the cutting edge of global competitiveness, providing its citizens and customers around the world the latest products and services in all sectors of the global economy, especially telecommunications, transportation, and medicine, and

WHEREAS, the research and development tax credit is responsible for returning \$2 to the economy for every dollar spent, and

WHEREAS, the research and development tax credit is an effective tool for stimulating additional research and development, and

WHEREAS, domestic companies that employ high-skilled, high-wage workers across this nation depend on the research and development tax credit for maintaining the nation's leadership in the world in technology, particularly biotechnology, manufacturing, and other key areas of business, and

WHEREAS, the research and development tax credit stimulates innovation-producing research and development investments in all 50 states, involving nearly 18,000 small, medium, and large companies, according to a report by Ernst & Young LLP, and

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WHEREAS, firms in all major industries claim the research and development tax credit, with the principal industries claiming the credit being those involved in manufacturing, the provision of professional, scientific, or technical services, and information technology, and

WHEREAS, a recent study showed nearly 2,400 firms in Florida reported conducting research and development activities in 2005, and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States must create a permanent research and development tax credit in order to enhance its incentive value, because companies would be able to count on the credit throughout the term of their multiyear research and development projects, and

WHEREAS, every time the research and development tax credit expires, it places this country's innovation economy at risk, and

WHEREAS, the research and development tax credit expired on December 31, 2009, for the 14th time since being originally enacted into law in 1981, and

WHEREAS, H.R. 422 and S. 1203 both strengthen and make permanent the research and development tax credit, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States is urged to enact H.R. 422 or S. 1203 to strengthen and make permanent the research and development tax credit.
