Section 401.2915, Florida Statutes, is amended 23 to read: 24 401.2915 Automated external defibrillators.-It is the 25 intent of the Legislature that an automated external 26 defibrillator may be used by any person for the purpose of 27 saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest. In order to achieve that goal, the Legislature intends to encourage training 28 Page 1 of 6

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29 in lifesaving first aid and set standards for and encourage the 30 use of automated external defibrillators.

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(1) As used in this section, the term:

32 (a) "Automated external defibrillator" means a device as
33 defined in s. 768.1325(2)(b).

34 (b) "Defibrillation" means the administration of a
35 controlled electrical charge to the heart to restore a viable
36 cardiac rhythm.

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(2) In order to promote public health and safety:

(a) All persons who use an automated external defibrillator are encouraged to obtain appropriate training, to include completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and demonstrated proficiency in the use of an automated external defibrillator.

Any person or entity in possession of an automated 45 (b) external defibrillator is encouraged to notify the local 46 emergency medical services medical director of the location of 47 48 the automated external defibrillator. The owner, operator, or 49 administrator responsible for a place of public assembly, as 50 defined in s. 768.1326, shall notify the local emergency medical 51 services medical director of the location of the automated 52 external defibrillator. The state agency responsible for a 53 building or portion of a building owned or leased by the state 54 shall notify the local emergency medical services medical 55 director of the location of the automated external 56 defibrillator. The local emergency medical services medical

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57 <u>director shall maintain a registry of these automated external</u> 58 defibrillator locations.

(c) Any person who uses an automated external defibrillator shall activate the emergency medical services system as soon as possible upon use of the automated external defibrillator.

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(3) Any person who intentionally or willfully:

(a) Tampers with or otherwise renders an automated
external defibrillator inoperative, except during such time as
the automated external defibrillator is being serviced, tested,
repaired, recharged, or inspected or except pursuant to court
order; or

69 (b) Obliterates the serial number on an automated external70 defibrillator for purposes of falsifying service records,

72 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as 73 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. Paragraph (a) does not 74 apply to the owner of the automated external defibrillator or 75 the owner's authorized representative or agent.

76 (4) Each local and state law enforcement vehicle may carry77 an automated external defibrillator.

78 Section 2. Section 768.1326, Florida Statutes, is amended 79 to read:

80 768.1326 Placement of automated external defibrillators in 81 state buildings <u>and places of public assembly</u>; rulemaking 82 authority.-

83 (1) No later than January 1, 2003, The State Surgeon 84 General shall adopt rules to establish guidelines on the Page 3 of 6

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85 appropriate placement of automated external defibrillator 86 devices in buildings or portions of buildings owned or leased by the state and in places of public assembly, and shall establish, 87 88 by rule, recommendations on procedures for the deployment of 89 automated external defibrillator devices in such buildings and places of public assembly in accordance with the guidelines. The 90 91 Secretary of Management Services shall assist the State Surgeon 92 General in the development of the guidelines. The guidelines for 93 the placement of the automated external defibrillators shall 94 take into account the typical number of employees and visitors in the building or place of public assembly buildings, the 95 extent of the need for security measures regarding the building 96 or place of public assembly buildings, special circumstances in 97 98 the building or a portion of the building buildings or portions 99 of buildings such as high electrical voltages or extreme heat or 100 cold, and such other factors as the State Surgeon General and 101 Secretary of Management Services determine to be appropriate. 102 For purposes of this section, the term "place of public 103 assembly" means a location with a seating capacity of at least 104 1,000 people and includes, but is not limited to, any stadium, 105 ballpark, gymnasium, field house, arena, civic center, or 106 similar facility used for the conduct of sporting events and any 107 concert hall, recital hall, theater, indoor or outdoor amphitheatre, or other auditorium used for the presentation of 108 109 musical performances or concerts. The term does not include any 110 church, synagogue, or other not-for-profit religious 111 organization or any public association or public library. 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automated external defibrillators in buildings or portions of buildings owned or leased by the state <u>or in places of public</u> assembly shall include:

116 <u>(a) (1)</u> A reference list of appropriate training courses in 117 the use of such devices, including the role of cardiopulmonary 118 resuscitation;

119 (b) (2) The extent to which such devices may be used by 120 laypersons;

121 (c) (3) Manufacturer recommended maintenance and testing of 122 the devices; and

123 <u>(d) (4)</u> Coordination with local emergency medical services 124 systems regarding <u>registration of automated external</u> 125 <u>defibrillators and documentation of</u> the incidents of use of the 126 devices.

128 In formulating these guidelines and recommendations, the State 129 Surgeon General may consult with all appropriate public and 130 private entities, including national and local public health 131 organizations that seek to improve the survival rates of 132 individuals who experience cardiac arrest.

133 (2) Whenever a place of public assembly is used for
134 publicly or privately sponsored events or activities, the
135 owners, operators, or administrators responsible for the place
136 of public assembly shall require the presence of at least one
137 employee or volunteer who is trained in accordance with s.
138 401.2915 in the operation and use of an automated external
139 defibrillator.

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140	(3) The use of an automated external defibrillator by an
141	employee or a volunteer under this section is covered under ss.
142	768.13 and 768.1325.
143	(4) This section may not be construed to prohibit a county
144	or municipal government from enacting, implementing, and
145	enforcing any local ordinance that expands the requirements of
146	this section for the placement of automated external
147	defibrillators in a place of pubic assembly.
148	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.

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
