A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Prostate Cancer Awareness Program; amending s. 381.911, F.S.; revising the structure and objectives of the Prostate Cancer Awareness Program within the Department of Health; revising the purpose of the program; revising requirements for program implementation; requiring the department and the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center to establish the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center Prostate Cancer Task Force to replace the Prostate Cancer Advisory Committee; providing for the appointment of task force members by the State Surgeon General upon specified recommendations; providing for terms of members; providing for meetings and duties; requiring an annual report to the Governor, the Legislature, and the State Surgeon General; removing a provision requiring the program to coordinate efforts with the Florida Public Health Institute, Inc.; providing an effective date.

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WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that prostate cancer is a major public health problem and that promoting awareness of this disease is in the public interest of this state, and

WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health's Florida Cancer Plan 2003-2006, prostate cancer was the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Florida, accounting for one in every four cancer diagnoses, and

WHEREAS, the costs for screening, staging, and treating prostate cancer patients in both dollars and morbidity continue

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to rise, which threatens the foundation of this state's health system, and

WHEREAS, because African-American men are 2.8 times more likely to succumb to prostate cancer than their white counterparts, a call for action is mandatory, and

WHEREAS, there are currently no organized, active, or effective mechanisms in Florida to mitigate the incidence, lack of community education and awareness, racial and ethnic disparities, and rising burdens of prostate cancer, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to work with the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center to establish the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center Prostate Cancer Task Force and to make changes to the Prostate Cancer Awareness Program in order to more effectively serve the needs of the people of Florida, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 381.911, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

381.911 Prostate Cancer Awareness Program.-

- (1) To the extent that funds are specifically made available for this purpose, the Prostate Cancer Awareness Program is established within the Department of Health. The purpose of this program is to:
- (a) Meet and exceed implement the recommendations offered in of January 2000 by of the Florida Prostate Cancer Task Force.

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(b) to Provide for statewide outreach to promote prostate cancer awareness.

- (c) Communicate the advantages of early detection.
- (d) Report recent progress in prostate cancer research and the availability of clinical trials.
- (e) Minimize health disparities through outreach, education, and screening events.

- (f) Communicate best practice principles to physicians involved in the care of prostate cancer patients.
- (g) Establish a communication platform for patients and their advocates and health education activities to ensure that men are aware of and appropriately seek medical counseling for prostate cancer as an early-detection health care measure.
- (2) For purposes of implementing the program, the

 Department of Health and the <u>University of Florida Prostate</u>

 Disease Center may work with other organizations and

 institutions to create a systemic focus on increasing community

 education and awareness about prostate cancer by <u>Florida Public</u>

 Health Institute, Inc., may:
- (a) <u>Conducting Conduct</u> activities directly or <u>entering</u> enter into <u>contracts</u> a <u>contract</u> with a qualified nonprofit community education entities <u>entity</u>.
- (b) <u>Seeking Seek</u> any available gifts, grants, or funds from the state, the Federal Government, philanthropic foundations, and industry or business groups.
- (3) The University of Florida Prostate Disease Center

 shall collaborate with the Department of Health to establish the

 University of Florida Prostate Disease Center Prostate Cancer

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Task Force and lead the task force in developing and implementing strategies to improve early detection and, consequently, reduce the number of patients succumbing to prostate cancer. A Prostate Cancer Advisory committee is created to advise and assist the Department of Health and the Florida Public Health Institute, Inc., in implementing the program.

- (a) The State Surgeon General shall appoint, upon recommendation of the Executive Director of the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center in consultation with the Department of Health's Comprehensive Cancer Control Program and the Florida Cancer Control Program, geographically and institutionally diverse task force the advisory committee members, who shall consist of:
- 1. <u>Two</u> Three persons from prostate cancer survivor groups or cancer-related advocacy groups.
- 2. Three persons who are scientists or clinicians from instate public universities or community practitioners who are known experts in prostate cancer care, research, or education research organizations.
- 3. Three persons who are engaged in the practice of a cancer-related medical specialty from health organizations committed to cancer research and control.
- 4. The Executive Director of the University of Florida
 Prostate Disease Center or his or her designee.
- (b) Members shall serve without compensation but are entitled to reimbursement, pursuant to s. 112.061, for per diem and travel expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.

4-year term, except that the Executive Director of the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center or his or her designee shall serve as a permanent member of the task force. For the purpose of providing staggered terms, of the initial appointments, four members shall be appointed to 2-year terms and four members shall be appointed to 4-year terms. A member of the council may be removed at any time by the State Surgeon General, who shall appoint a replacement upon the recommendation of the Executive Director of the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center in consultation with other task force members and the Department of Health's designated subcommittees.

- (d) The task force shall meet twice a year and at other times upon the call of the Executive Director of the University of Florida Prostate Disease Center or a majority of the task force members.
- (e) Five members of the task force shall constitute a quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members present is required for final action.
 - (f) The task force shall:

- 1. Present prostate cancer-related policy recommendations to the Department of Health and other appropriate governmental entities.
- 2. Verify the accuracy of prostate cancer information disseminated to the public.
- 3. Develop effective communication channels among all private and public entities across the state that are involved in prostate cancer education, research, treatment, and patient

4. Plan, develop, and implement activities designed to heighten awareness and educate residents of this state, especially residents in underserved areas, regarding the importance of early detection and effective treatment options for prostate cancer.

- 5. Disseminate information on recent progress in prostate cancer research and the availability of clinical trials.
- 6. Minimize health disparities through outreach, education, and screening events.
- 7. Communicate best practice principles to physicians involved in the care of prostate cancer patients.
- 8. Establish a communication platform for patients and their advocates.
- 9. Conduct an annual prostate cancer symposium that brings physicians, researchers, community leaders, prostate cancer survivors, and prostate cancer advocates together to highlight recent advances in prostate cancer research, clinical trials, and best practices in the prevention of the disease and to promote strategies for successful rural and urban outreach, community education, and increased awareness.
- 10. Submit and present an annual report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the State Surgeon General by January 15, beginning in 2011, that contains recommendations for legislative changes necessary to decrease the incidence of prostate cancer, decrease racial and ethnic disparities, and promote increased community education and awareness.
