A bill to be entitled

An act relating to premarital preparation; amending s. 741.0306, F.S.; providing for the creation and revision of the Florida Marriage Handbook; creating the Marriage Education Committee; providing for membership on the committee; specifying the content for Parts A and B of the handbook; requiring the committee to be reconstituted once every 10 years for the purpose of reviewing and updating the content in the handbook; requiring the committee to submit a report to the Legislature by a specified date; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 741.0306, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

741.0306 Creation <u>and revisions</u> of <u>the Florida Marriage</u>
Handbook a family law handbook.-

(1) The Marriage Education Committee and Based upon their willingness to undertake this project, there shall be created by the Family Law Section of The Florida Bar shall create the Florida Marriage a Handbook. Part A of the handbook shall provide resources, information, and skills to help couples have a healthy and successful marriage. Part B of the handbook shall explain explaining those sections of Florida law pertaining to the rights and responsibilities under Florida law of marital partners to each other and to their children, both during a marriage and upon dissolution. The material in Part B of the

handbook or other suitable electronic media shall be reviewed for accuracy by the Family Court Steering Committee of the Florida Supreme Court $\underline{\text{before}}$ $\underline{\text{prior}}$ to publication and distribution.

- (2) The Marriage Education Committee shall consist of six marriage education and family advocates, two of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, two of whom shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, and two of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The committee shall be appointed upon the act becoming a law and shall be reconstituted once every 10 years for the purpose of reviewing and updating the content in Part A of the handbook. The appointed members shall be appointed to a 1-year term or until completion of the review process. The committee shall be placed with the Department of Children and Family Services for administrative purposes only.
- (3) (2) The handbook must Such handbooks shall be available from the clerk of the circuit court upon application for a marriage license. The clerks may also make the information in the handbook available on videotape or other electronic media and are encouraged to provide a list of course providers and sites at which marriage and relationship skill-building classes are available.
- (4) The Marriage Education Committee shall provide the information contained in Part A of the handbook and shall review and update the information once every 10 years. The content of Part A may include, but need not be limited to:
 - (a) Resources dealing with conflict resolution,

communication skills, family expectations, financial
responsibilities and management, and children and parenting
responsibilities.

- (b) Current information from marriage education and family advocates which is intended to assist couples in forming and maintaining a long-term marital relationship.
- (c) Information regarding premarital education, marriage enrichment education, and resources that are available to help restore a marriage that is potentially moving toward dissolution.
- (d) Contact information and website links to additional resources and local professional and community services to further assist couples.
- (5)(3) The information contained in Part B of the handbook or other electronic media presentation shall be provided by the Family Law Section of The Florida Bar and may be reviewed and updated annually, and may include, but need not be limited to:
- (a) Prenuptial agreements; as a contract and as an opportunity to structure financial arrangements and other aspects of the marital relationship.
- (b) Shared parental responsibility for children and the determination of a parenting plan, including a time-sharing schedule.
 - (c) Permanent relocation restrictions.
- (d) Child support for minor children; both parents are obligated for support in accordance with the applicable child support guidelines schedule.
 - (e) Property rights, including equitable distribution,

premarital property, and nonmarital property.

- (f) Alimony, including temporary, permanent rehabilitative, and lump sum.
- (g) Domestic violence and child abuse and neglect, including penalties and other ramifications of false reporting.
- (h) Court process for dissolution with or without legal assistance, including who may attend, the recording of proceedings, how to access those records, and the cost of such access.
- (i) Parent education course requirements for divorcing parents with children.
- (j) Community resources that are available for separating or divorcing persons and their children.
- (k) Women's rights specified in the Battered Women's Bill of Rights.
- (6)(4) The material contained in the such a handbook may also be provided through videotape or other suitable electronic media. The information contained in Part B of the handbook or other electronic media presentation shall be reviewed and updated annually.
- (7) (5) The Florida Marriage existing family law Handbook shall be reviewed and a report provided to the Legislature every 10 years by October 1, 2008, or as soon thereafter as practicable, with explanations about changes made to the handbook and recommendations for further updating the handbook.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
