Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (i) is added to subsection (3) of section 744.331, Florida Statutes, to read:

744.331 Procedures to determine incapacity.-

(3) EXAMINING COMMITTEE.-

(i) The report of each committee member filed with the clerk of the court is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This paragraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2015, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to exempt from public records requirements all reports of examining committee members, whether initial, amended, or supplementary, in order to preserve the privacy of an alleged incapacitated person. The Legislature finds that the public disclosure of financial or medical information contained in the
