Senator Sobel moved the following:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

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Delete lines 366 - 417
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4 and insert:

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5 (a) The local government has verified impaired waters and 6 is facing existing or possible requirements for achieving the 7 total maximum daily load established under state or federal law; 8 demonstrated, as part of a comprehensive program to address 9 nonpoint sources of nutrient pollution which is science-based, and economically and technically feasible, that additional or 10 11 more stringent standards than the model ordinance are necessary in order to adequately address urban fertilizer contributions to 12 nonpoint source nutrient loading to a water body. 13

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14 (b) The local government has verified harm to human health 15 or harm to the environment which warrants additional consumer 16 fertilizer requirements; or 17 (c) The local government will improve water quality or 18 prevent future impacts of consumer fertilizers on the 19 environment. 20 (5) If the local government proposes more stringent 21 standards, it must document documents that it has requested and 22 considered all relevant scientific information, including input 23 from the department, the institute, the Department of 24 Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the University of 25 Florida's Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, if provided, on the need for additional or more stringent 26 27 provisions to address fertilizer use as a contributor to water quality degradation. All documentation must become part of the 28 29 public record before adoption of the additional or more 30 stringent criteria. (6) (3) Any county or municipal government that adopted its 31 32 own fertilizer use ordinance before January 1, 2009, is exempt 33 from this section. Ordinances adopted or amended on or after 34 January 1, 2009, must substantively conform to the most recent 35 version of the model fertilizer ordinance and are subject to subsections (2)-(5) (1) and (2), as applicable. 36 37 38 39 And the title is amended as follows: 40 Delete line 29 and insert: 41 42 amending s. 487.163, F.S.; requiring

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
