House Memorial 1 2 A memorial to the Congress of the United States urging 3 Congress to balance the federal budget and hold itself to 4 the same fiscal standards to which it expects its citizens 5 to adhere. 6 7 WHEREAS, the Congressional Budget Resolution for fiscal 8 year 2011 is pending in Congress, and 9 WHEREAS, the current national debt is approaching \$12 10 trillion, a cost of nearly \$40,000 for each man, woman, and 11 child in the United States, and is growing at an alarming rate with the Obama Administration predicting the addition of almost 12 13 \$5 trillion in new debt over the next 5 years, and 14 WHEREAS, the 2009 national deficit is equal to nearly 10 15 percent of the country's entire economic output, a precedent not 16 seen since 1950, and WHEREAS, if the White House budget projections come to 17 pass, the national debt will exceed the current gross domestic 18 19 product of the United States of \$16.2 trillion by the end of 20 2012, and 21 WHEREAS, the governance that authorized such debt and 22 deficits has led to unfunded federal liabilities for Social 23 Security and Medicare of more than \$106 trillion as of December 24 2009, equal to \$345,548 per American, and 25 WHEREAS, this spending has created national security 26 concerns that the amount of funds paid by the Federal Government on debt interest alone in 2008, over \$400 billion, was 27 approximately 10 times the amount of funds spent on the 28 Page 1 of 2

29 Department of Homeland Security that year, and 30 WHEREAS, equally as concerning, foreign nations owned 31 approximately 30 percent of the federal debt in 2009 and are, 32 therefore, in a unique position of authority with respect to the 33 United States, and 34 WHEREAS, the Obama Administration's projections show our 35 national budget deficits not returning to sustainable levels 36 over the next 10 years, rising sharply after President Obama 37 leaves office, and 38 WHEREAS, credit agencies have begun to warn that the nation 39 may lose its AAA credit rating because of the size of these federal budget deficits, deficits that could potentially 40 41 destabilize government finances and financial markets, and 42 WHEREAS, millions of people in this country have made 43 difficult choices discerning between wants and needs and have 44 taken the responsible steps to curb personal spending in these difficult economic times, NOW, THEREFORE, 45 46 47 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 48 49 That the Congress of the United States is urged to balance 50 the federal budget and hold itself to the same fiscal standards 51 to which it expects its citizens to adhere. 52 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be 53 dispatched to the President of the United States, to the 54 President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the 55 United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress. 56 Page 2 of 2
