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30	the Department of Health, shall adopt rules for the use of
31	prescribed pancreatic enzyme supplements which shall include
32	provisions to protect the safety of all students from the misuse
33	or abuse of the supplements. A school district, county health
34	department, public-private partner, and their employees and
35	volunteers shall be indemnified by the parent of a student
36	authorized to use prescribed pancreatic enzyme supplements for
37	any and all liability with respect to the student's use of the
38	supplements under this paragraph.
39	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
