An act relating to the jamming of electronic speedmeasuring devices; creating s. 316.1907, F.S.;
prohibiting a vehicle from being equipped with any
device that is designed for, or is capable of,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 316.1907, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

(1) (a) A vehicle may not be equipped with any device that is designed for, or is capable of, jamming, scrambling, neutralizing, disabling, or otherwise interfering with a radar, laser, or any other electronic device used by a law enforcement

agency to measure the speed of a moving vehicle.

(b) A person may not use, buy, possess, manufacture, sell, or otherwise distribute any device that is designed for jamming,

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
