Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 947.174, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

947.174 Subsequent interviews.-

> (b) For any inmate convicted of murder, attempted murder, sexual battery, or attempted sexual battery, or any inmate who has been sentenced to a 25-year minimum mandatory sentence previously provided in s. 775.082, and whose presumptive parole release date is more than 7 - 5 years after the date of the initial interview, a hearing examiner shall schedule an interview for review of the presumptive parole release date. The Such interview shall take place once within 7 - 5 years after the initial interview and once every 7 - 5 years thereafter if the commission finds that it is not reasonable to expect that parole will be granted at a hearing during the following years and states the bases for the finding in writing. For any inmate who is within 7 years of his or her tentative release date, the commission may establish an interview date before prior to the 7-year $\frac{5-year}{}$ schedule.
