Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 218 and 219

insert:

Section 3. Subsection (4) of section 627.0613, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

8 627.0613 Consumer Advocate.—The Chief Financial Officer 9 must appoint a consumer advocate who must represent the general 10 public of the state before the department and the office. The 11 consumer advocate must report directly to the Chief Financial 12 Officer, but is not otherwise under the authority of the

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13	department or of any employee of the department. The consumer
14	advocate has such powers as are necessary to carry out the
15	duties of the office of consumer advocate, including, but not
16	limited to, the powers to:
17	(4) By June 1, 2012, and each June 1 thereafter, prepare an
18	annual report card for each authorized personal residential
19	property insurer, on a form and using a letter-grade scale
20	developed by the commission by rule, which <u>objectively</u> grades
21	each insurer based on the following factors:
22	(a) The number and nature of <u>valid</u> consumer complaints, as
23	a market share ratio, received by the department against the
24	insurer.
25	(b) The disposition of all <u>valid</u> complaints received by the
26	department.
27	(c) The average length of time for payment of claims by the
28	insurer.
29	(d) Any other measurable and objective factors the
30	commission identifies as <u>capable of</u> assisting policyholders in
31	making informed choices about homeowner's insurance.
