Delete lines 20 - 38

and insert:

(1) If the parent or legal guardian of a minor believes that the minor exhibits symptoms of autism spectrum disorder, the parent or legal guardian may report his or her observation to a physician licensed in this state. The physician shall perform screening in accordance with American Academy of Pediatrics' guidelines. If the physician determines that referral to a specialist is medically necessary, he or she shall refer the minor to an appropriate specialist to determine 12

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13	whether the minor meets diagnostic criteria for autism spectrum
14	disorder. If the physician determines that referral to a
15	specialist is not medically necessary, the physician shall
16	inform the parent or legal guardian that they can self-refer to
17	the Early Steps intervention program or other specialist in
18	autism. This section does not apply to a physician providing
19	<u>care under s. 395.1041.</u>
20	(2) As used in this section, the term "appropriate
21	specialist" means a qualified professional who is experienced in
22	the evaluation of autism spectrum disorder, is licensed in this
23	state, and has training in validated diagnostic tools. The term

25	(a) A psychologist;
