A bill to be entitled

An act relating to charter technical career centers; creating the Charter Technical Career Center Associate in Applied Science and Associate in Science Degrees Program; providing a purpose for the program; authorizing charter technical career centers to submit proposals to the State Board of Education to offer specified associate in applied science degree and associate in science degree programs; authorizing charter technical career centers to offer such degree programs through partnerships with community colleges or direct authority; providing for certain criteria to award the degrees on a limited basis; requiring that the board adopt rules; requiring that a participating charter technical career center implement the program through a memorandum of agreement; prohibiting a charter technical career center from requesting funding for the initial costs associated with implementing the degree programs for a specified amount of time after receiving authorization; requiring that funding for operational costs be at the same level as the funding for workforce development programs; providing requirements for participating charter technical career centers; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. (1) The Charter Technical Career Center

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Associate in Applied Science and Associate in Science Degrees

Program is created for the purpose of authorizing charter

technical career centers to offer associate in applied science

degree and associate in science degree programs in order to meet

local workforce needs. Charter technical career centers may

submit proposals to the State Board of Education to participate

in the program in their respective districts. Charter technical

career centers may offer the degree programs through

partnerships with community colleges or through direct authority

to award such degrees.

- (2) After receiving and reviewing a charter technical career center's proposal, the board may approve the proposal for a substantive change in accreditation status and authority to award specified associate in applied science and associate in science degrees on a limited basis, if certain criteria are met which relate to the demand for such programs; the unmet workforce need for graduates from such degree programs; and the availability of facilities, faculty, and other resources.
- (3) The board shall adopt rules providing guidelines for receiving, reviewing, and approving proposals submitted by charter technical career centers. The rules must establish an annual timeframe in which proposals are received. The rules must also require that a presentation be made to assist the board in its decision and that the Commissioner of Education make recommendations based on the proposals.
- (4) A charter technical career center that is authorized to offer an associate in applied science degree program or associate in science degree program shall implement the program in accordance with a memorandum of agreement entered into

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between the board and the center which outlines the expectations for administrative oversight and accountability for the initial and continued approval of the program.

- (5) A charter technical career center may not request additional funding for costs associated with the implementation and start-up of the associate in applied science and associate in science degree programs during the first 2 years after the charter technical career center receives authorization to offer such degree programs. Operational costs must be funded at the same level as funding for workforce development programs.
- (6) Each participating charter technical career center
  shall:
- (a) Maintain, as its primary mission, responsibility for responding to the community's needs for postsecondary career degree programs and workforce education programs;
- (b) Maintain an open-door admissions policy for associate degree programs and workforce education programs; and
- (c) Accept credit for courses meeting general education prerequisite requirements which are earned in an approved program at an accredited college or university.
- (7) Each charter technical career center participating in the program shall accept general education course credit from colleges accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools for the first 3 years of the program to avoid duplication of currently available courses.
- (8) Effective July 1, 2010, a charter technical career center may use the designation "technical college" rather than "center." Any charter technical career center that has used the designation "college" may continue to use such designation after
