32	Council <u>is established</u> to advise and assist the division <u>with</u>

37	appointed by the Secretary of State. Of the nine members, at

The use utilization of The Grove as a 257 museum of history shall emphasize the lives and accomplishments 258 of The Grove's first owner, Richard Keith Call, Florida's last 259 Territorial Governor, and LeRoy Collins, Florida's 33rd 260 Governor, who, with his wife, Mary Call Darby Collins, were the last owners of The Grove.
