(1) A county government, whether acting through its governing body or by an initiative, referendum, or any other process, may not enact any ordinance or policy that limits or prohibits a law enforcement officer, local official, or local governmental employee from communicating or cooperating with federal officials with regard to the immigration status of any person within this state.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county governmental entity or official may not prohibit or in any way restrict any governmental entity or government official from sending to, or receiving from, the United States Department of Homeland Security information regarding the citizenship or immigration status of any individual.

Section 3. Section 166.04935, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- (1) A municipal government, whether acting through its governing body or by an initiative, referendum, or any other process, may not enact any ordinance or policy that limits or prohibits a law enforcement officer, local official, or local governmental employee from communicating or cooperating with federal officials with regard to the immigration status of any person within this state.
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a municipal governmental entity or official may not prohibit or in any way restrict any governmental entity or government official from sending to, or receiving from, the United States Department of Homeland Security information regarding the citizenship or
