Section 1. Section 316.29545, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.29545 Window sunscreening exclusions; medical exemption; certain law enforcement vehicles <u>and private</u> investigative service vehicles exempt.-

10 (1) The department shall issue medical exemption 11 certificates to persons who are afflicted with Lupus, any 12 <u>autoimmune disease</u>, or <u>other</u> similar medical conditions which 13 require a limited exposure to light, which certificates shall

14 entitle the person to whom the certificate is issued to have sunscreening material on the windshield, side windows, and 15 16 windows behind the driver which is in violation of the requirements of ss. 316.2951-316.2957. The department shall 17 18 consult with the Medical Advisory Board established in s. 19 322.125 to provide guidance with respect to the autoimmune 20 diseases and other medical conditions which shall be included on, by rule, for the form of the medical certificate authorized 21 22 by this section. At a minimum, the medical exemption certificate 23 shall include a vehicle description with the make, model, year, 24 vehicle identification number, medical exemption decal number 25 issued for the vehicle, and the name of the person or persons who are the registered owners of the vehicle. A medical 26 27 exemption certificate shall be nontransferable and shall become null and void upon the sale or transfer of the vehicle 28 29 identified on the certificate.

30 (2) The department shall exempt all law enforcement
31 vehicles used in undercover or canine operations from the window
32 sunscreening requirements of ss. 316.2951-316.2957.

33 <u>(3) The department shall exempt from the window</u> 34 <u>sunscreening restrictions of ss. 316.2953, 316.2954, and</u> 35 <u>316.2956 vehicles that are owned or leased by private</u> 36 <u>investigative agencies or private investigators licensed under</u> 37 <u>chapter 493.</u>

38 <u>(4) (3)</u> The department may charge a fee in an amount 39 sufficient to defray the expenses of issuing a medical exemption 40 certificate as described in subsection (1).

41 (5) The department is authorized to promulgate rules for
 42 the implementation of this section.
