Senate Resolution

A resolution condemning any law, rule, or policy that punishes any person based on sexual orientation or HIV/AIDS status.

WHEREAS, a bill introduced on October 14, 2009, by a member of Parliament in Uganda would expand penalties for homosexuality to include the death penalty and requires citizens of Uganda to report information about homosexuality to the police or face imprisonment, and

WHEREAS, many countries criminalize homosexuality, and in some countries, such as Iran, Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, and Sudan, the penalty for homosexuality includes the death penalty, and

WHEREAS, the United States, in seeking to promote the core American principles of equality and "Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness," has long championed the universality of human rights, and

WHEREAS, religious leaders in the United States, along with representatives from the Vatican and the Anglican Church, have stated that laws criminalizing homosexuality are unjust, and

WHEREAS, the people and Government of the United States recognize that such laws undermine this country's commitment in globally combating the human immunodeficiency virus infection or acquired immune deficiency syndrome by stigmatizing and criminalizing vulnerable communities, and

WHEREAS, no human being should be punished or targeted for assault, intimidation, or harassment of any kind based on sexual orientation, gender identity, or having the human immunodeficiency virus infection or the acquired immune
