(1) Except as provided in subsection (2), any person who communicates or causes to be communicated orally, in writing, or through the use of electronic or other means a threat to unlawfully do physical harm to the person or property of another in the course of committing an act of domestic violence, as defined in s. 741.28, commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(2) If Any person who writes or composes and also sends or procures the sending of any letter or inscribed communication in writing, or using electronic or other means, so written or composed, whether such letter or communication be signed or anonymous, to any person, containing a threat to kill or to

unlawfully do bodily injury to the person to whom such letter or communication is sent, or a threat to kill or unlawfully do bodily injury to any member of the family of the person to whom such letter or communication is sent commits, the person so writing or composing and so sending or procuring the sending of such letter or communication, shall be guilty of a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
