20	portion of a rural area of critical economic concern designated
21	as provided in s. 288.0656(7), Florida Statutes, may apply to
22	the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development to amend
23	the boundary of the enterprise zone to expand the area of the
24	enterprise zone by not more than 3 square miles.
25	(2) Notwithstanding the area limitations specified in s.
26	290.0055(4), Florida Statutes, the Office of Tourism, Trade, and
27	Economic Development may approve the boundary amendment request
28	if the area continues to satisfy the remaining requirements of
