An act relating to student voter education; providing for a voter-education program; requiring that each district school board and county supervisor of elections jointly provide the program for high school students who are eligible to register or preregister to vote; requiring that such education consist of a mandatory presentation made by the supervisor of elections to public high school students who are eligible to register or preregister to vote; requiring that the presentation be made available to nonpublic high schools upon request; providing quidelines for the content of the program; requiring that the program be conducted during school hours and at least once each term of the school year; prohibiting the exclusion of any student who is eligible to register or preregister to vote; requiring that the voter-education program be provided to students enrolled in a magnet school; providing an effective date.

Section 1. (1) Each district school board and county supervisor of elections shall cooperate to provide voter education to high school students who are eligible to register or preregister to vote. The voter-education program shall consist of a mandatory presentation to the students and be made available to nonpublic high schools upon their request. Each supervisor of elections shall conduct the presentation.

(2) The presentation must include information concerning:

- (a) How to register to vote and preregister.
- (b) The operation of voting machines.
- (c) When and where to vote.

- (d) The process of voting, including voter identification requirements.
  - (e) The importance of voting.
- (3) The voter-education program must provide students with sufficient information and time to complete and hand in to the supervisor of elections applications for voter registration.
- (4) The voter-education program shall be conducted during school hours and at least once each term of the school year in order to reach a maximum number of students in the most effective and efficient manner.
- (5) A student who is eligible to register or preregister to vote may not be excluded from the voter-education program.
- (6) The voter-education program must be provided to students enrolled in a magnet school in accordance with this section.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
