HB 439 2010

A bill to be entitled

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An act relating to disability awareness; amending s. 1003.4205, F.S.; requiring district school boards to provide disability history and awareness instruction in all K-12 public schools; requiring certification of individuals delivering the instruction; requiring the Governor's Commission on Disabilities to initiate a study on disability awareness training to be conducted by a private nonprofit entity; providing requirements for the study and submission of findings to the commission; requiring the commission to oversee a statewide disability awareness training provider and certification program; providing program components to include requirements for approval of providers and certification of individuals to provide disability awareness instruction; providing for the payment of certain fees; requiring the commission to promote disability awareness training in all public entities in the state; requiring rulemaking; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1003.4205, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.4205 Disability history and awareness instruction. -

Each district school board shall may provide disability history and awareness instruction in all K-12 public schools in the district during the first 2 weeks in October each

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year. The district school board shall designate these 2 weeks as "Disability History and Awareness Weeks."

- (2) (a) During this 2-week period, students shall may be provided intensive instruction to expand their knowledge, understanding, and awareness of individuals with disabilities, the history of disability, and the disability rights movement. Disability history shall may include the events and timelines of the development and evolution of services to, and the civil rights of, individuals with disabilities. Disability history shall may also include the contributions of specific individuals with disabilities, including the contributions of acknowledged national leaders.
- (b) The instruction <u>shall</u> <u>may</u> be integrated into the existing school curriculum in ways including, but not limited to, supplementing lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or providing other school-related activities. <u>Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year</u>, the instruction <u>shall may</u> be delivered by <u>individuals who are certified to provide disability awareness instruction qualified school personnel or by knowledgeable guest speakers</u>, with a particular focus on including individuals with disabilities <u>as instructors</u>.
- (3) The goals of disability history and awareness instruction include:
- (a) Better treatment for individuals with disabilities, especially for youth in school, and increased attention to preventing the bullying or harassment of students with disabilities.
 - (b) Encouragement to individuals with disabilities to

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develop increased self-esteem, resulting in more individuals with disabilities gaining pride in being an individual with a disability, obtaining postsecondary education, entering the workforce, and contributing to their communities.

- (c) Reaffirmation of the local, state, and federal commitment to the full inclusion in society of, and the equal opportunity for, all individuals with disabilities.
- Section 2. <u>Disability awareness training standards</u>, protocol, and curriculum; certification.—
- initiate a study on disability awareness training beginning July 1, 2010, to be conducted by a private nonprofit entity that promotes disability awareness in the classroom and the community at large and provides disability awareness training. State agencies and programs shall cooperate with the private nonprofit entity as it conducts the study to establish disability awareness training standards, protocol, and curriculum. The study shall:
- (a) Evaluate and recommend to the commission standards and criteria necessary for authorizing providers to conduct disability awareness training.
- (b) Establish guidelines and curriculum for a certification program for disability awareness instructors.
- (c) Provide to the commission a summary of the current trends in disability awareness training.

The private nonprofit entity conducting the study shall submit its findings to the commission by July 1, 2011.

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(2) Beginning July 1, 2011, the commission shall oversee a statewide disability awareness training provider and certification program which shall include, but not be limited to, the following components:

- (a) Disability awareness training providers must meet all criteria established and published by the commission to be approved to conduct continuing education courses to certify individuals as disability awareness training instructors. A provider may charge a service fee for the continuing education courses in an amount that is sufficient to cover its costs in providing the courses.
- (b) To be approved by the commission, a disability awareness training provider must have a minimum of 5 years of experience working in the field of disabilities, submit an application to the commission to provide disability awareness training, pay an application or renewal fee set by the commission not to exceed \$200, and submit an annual report to the commission documenting the provider's training activities. An approved provider shall be required to renew its approved status with the commission every 3 years.
- (c) Approved providers must use the commission's approved training methods and curriculum materials for conducting continuing education courses.
- (d) A list of providers approved to offer disability

 awareness training for certification shall be published and made

 available to the public by the commission.
- (e) Individuals seeking certification to provide disability awareness instruction shall participate in continuing

Education courses conducted by commission-approved providers.

Individuals who successfully complete the required disability awareness continuing education courses shall be certified by the commission to provide disability awareness instruction in the state and shall pay a certification or certification renewal fee set by the commission not to exceed \$100. Certified individuals shall be required to renew certification with the commission every 3 years.

- of, and the equal opportunity for, individuals with disabilities through disability awareness training in all public entities in the state. Activities that provide instruction to expand knowledge, understanding, and awareness of individuals with disabilities, the history of disability, and the disability rights movement shall be encouraged.
