5 (g) By January 1, 2012, the amount of construction and 6 demolition debris processed and recycled prior to disposal at a 7 permitted materials recovery facility or at any other permitted 8 disposal facility shall be reported by the county of origin to 9 the department and to the county on an annual basis in 10 accordance with rules adopted by the department. The rules shall 11 establish criteria to ensure accurate and consistent reporting for purposes of determining the recycling rate in s. 403.706. 12 13 The rules also shall provide that, to the extent economically

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14 feasible, all construction and demolition debris must be processed prior to disposal, either at a permitted waste 15 16 processing facility or a permitted disposal facility. It shall 17 be presumed that recycling pursuant to the requirements of this paragraph is economically feasible unless otherwise demonstrated 18 19 by the owner or operator of the facility pursuant to department rule. This requirement does not apply to any recovered materials 20 21 that have been source separated and offered for recycling or to materials that have been previously processed. As part of the 2.2 23 rule development process, the department shall appoint a 24 technical advisory committee including a representative from the 25 Florida Association of Counties, the Florida League of Cities, 26 the construction and demolition debris industry, the Florida 27 Home Builders Association, the Florida Sunshine Chapter of the Solid Wastes Association of North America, and the Florida 28 29 Chapter of the National Solid Waste Management Association, to aid in the development of such rules. It is the policy of the 30 Legislature to encourage facilities to recycle. The department 31 32 shall establish criteria and guidelines that encourage recycling 33 where practical and provide for the use of recycled materials in 34 a manner that protects the public health and the environment. Facilities are authorized to recycle, provided such activities 35 36 do not conflict with such criteria and guidelines.

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
