An act relating to procurement of commodities and contractual services; creating s. 287.05705, F.S.; providing that an agency, county, or municipality that is required to make purchases of commodities or contractual services through competitive solicitation must provide vendors the option to submit competitive sealed bids through a uniform secure electronic interactive Internet system; requiring specified notification in invitations to bid; requiring the Department of Management Services to adopt rules establishing procedures and requirements for the electronic submission, receipt, and processing of competitive sealed bids; providing exemptions; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 287.05705, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 287.05705 Online submission of competitive sealed bids.-
- (1) Except as provided in subsections (4) and (5), an agency, county, or municipality that is required to make purchases of commodities or contractual services through competitive solicitation must provide vendors the option to submit competitive sealed bids through a uniform secure electronic interactive Internet system.
- (2) Agencies, counties, and municipalities must include in invitations to bid notification to vendors apprising them of the

option to submit sealed bids electronically and of any special conditions, requirements, or procedures particular to electronic submissions of competitive sealed bids.

- (3) The department shall adopt rules establishing procedures and requirements for the electronic submission, receipt, and processing of competitive sealed bids under this section.
- (4) A county or municipality that is without available high-speed Internet access is exempt from the requirements of subsections (1) and (2) until such time as high-speed Internet access becomes available to the county or municipality.
- (5) A county or municipality with a population of less than 25,000 is exempt from the requirements of subsections (1) and (2).
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
