Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Section 501.20795, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 501.20795 Disclosure of age of tires by retail tire dealers.-(1) A retail tire dealer shall, no later than the time of sale, before dismounting a tire to be replaced by a new or used passenger or light truck tire sold by the dealer and before mounting a new or used passenger or light truck tire sold by the dealer, provide a written disclosure of the age of the replacement tire to the purchaser. The disclosure must be initialed and dated by the purchaser, who must be given a copy, and the dealer must retain the original for at least 3 years. The disclosure shall include the following information: (a) The week and year the tire was manufactured; (b) The length of the remaining factory warranty on the tire; and
