An act relating to victim advocate services; creating s. 1006.671, F.S.; requiring that each postsecondary educational institution provide an advocate to assist students who are victims of violent crime; requiring that the advocate complete a specified number of hours in victim advocacy training and enlist the assistance of public and voluntary health, education, welfare, and rehabilitation agencies or groups and law enforcement

agencies; requiring that an advocate be made available on

any campus that provides student housing or has a minimum

number of full-time students; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1006.671, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

educational institution shall provide an advocate to aid students who are victims of violent crime. The victim advocate must have completed at least 30 hours of victim advocacy training and shall enlist the assistance of public and voluntary health, education, welfare, and rehabilitation agencies or groups and law enforcement agencies in coordinating services. An advocate must be made available on any campus that provides student housing or has 10,000 or more full-time students.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
