(2) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Medicaid and Public Assistance Fraud
Strike Force is created within the department to oversee and
coordinate state and local efforts to eliminate Medicaid and

12 public assistance fraud and to recover state and federal funds.

13	The strike force shall serve in an advisory capacity and provide
14	recommendations and policy alternatives to the Chief Financial
15	Officer.
16	(3) MEMBERSHIPThe strike force shall consist of the
17	following 11 members who may not designate anyone to serve in
18	their place:
19	(a) The Chief Financial Officer, who shall serve as chair.
20	(b) The Attorney General, who shall serve as vice chair.
21	(c) The executive director of the Department of Law
22	Enforcement.
23	(d) The Secretary of Health Care Administration.
24	(e) The Secretary of Children and Family Services.
25	(f) The State Surgeon General.
26	(g) Five members appointed by the Chief Financial Officer,
27	consisting of two sheriffs, two chiefs of police, and one state
28	attorney. When making these appointments, the Chief Financial
29	Officer shall consider representation by geography, population,
30	ethnicity, and other relevant factors in order to ensure that
31	the membership of the strike force is representative of the
32	state as a whole.
33	(4) TERMS OF MEMBERSHIP; COMPENSATION; STAFF
34	(a) The five members appointed by the Chief Financial
35	Officer will serve 4-year terms; however, for the purpose of
36	providing staggered terms, of the initial appointments, two
37	members will be appointed to a 2-year term, two members will be
38	appointed to a 3-year term, and one member will be appointed to
39	a 4-year term. The remaining members are standing members of the
40	strike force and may not serve beyond the time he or she holds
41	the position that was the basis for strike force membership. A

42	vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original
43	appointment but only for the unexpired term.
44	(b) The Legislature finds that the strike force serves a
45	legitimate state, county, and municipal purpose and that service
46	on the strike force is consistent with a member's principal
47	service in a public office or employment. Therefore membership
48	on the strike force does not disqualify a member from holding
49	any other public office or from being employed by a public
50	entity, except that a member of the Legislature may not serve on
51	the strike force.
52	(c) Members of the strike force shall serve without
53	compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and
54	travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061. Reimbursements may be
55	paid from appropriations provided to the department by the
56	Legislature for the purposes of this section.
57	(d) The Chief Financial Officer shall appoint a chief of
58	staff for the strike force who must have experience, education,
59	and expertise in the fields of law, prosecution, or fraud
60	investigations and shall serve at the pleasure of the Chief
61	Financial Officer. The department shall provide the strike force
62	with staff necessary to assist the strike force in the
63	performance of its duties.
64	(5) MEETINGSThe strike force shall hold its
65	organizational session by March 1, 2011. Thereafter, the strike
66	force shall meet at least four times per year. Additional
67	meetings may be held if the chair determines that extraordinary
68	circumstances require an additional meeting. Members may appear
69	by electronic means. A majority of the members of the strike
70	force constitutes a quorum.

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71 (6) STRIKE FORCE DUTIES.-The strike force shall provide 72 advice and make recommendations, as necessary, to the Chief 73 Financial Officer. 74 (a) The strike force may advise the Chief Financial Officer 75 on initiatives that include, but are not limited to: 76 1. Conducting a census of local, state, and federal efforts to address Medicaid and public assistance fraud in this state, 77 78 including fraud detection, prevention, and prosecution, in order to discern overlapping missions, maximize existing resources, 79 80 and strengthen current programs. 81 2. Developing a strategic plan for coordinating and 82 targeting state and local resources for preventing and prosecuting Medicaid and public assistance fraud. The plan must 83 84 identify methods to enhance multiagency efforts that contribute 85 to achieving the state's goal of eliminating Medicaid and public 86 assistance fraud. 87 3. Identifying methods to implement innovative technology and data sharing in order to detect and analyze Medicaid and 88 89 public assistance fraud with speed and efficiency. 90 4. Establishing a program to provide grants to state and 91 local agencies that develop and implement effective Medicaid and public assistance fraud prevention, detection, and investigation 92 93 programs, which are evaluated by the strike force and ranked by 94 their potential to contribute to achieving the state's goal of 95 eliminating Medicaid and public assistance fraud. The grant 96 program may also provide startup funding for new initiatives by 97 local and state law enforcement or administrative agencies to 98 combat Medicaid and public assistance fraud. 99 5. Developing and promoting crime prevention services and

100	educational programs that serve the public, including, but not
101	limited to, a well-publicized rewards program for the
102	apprehension and conviction of criminals who perpetrate Medicaid
103	and public assistance fraud.
104	6. Providing grants, contingent upon appropriation, for
105	multiagency or state and local Medicaid and public assistance
106	fraud efforts, which would include, but are not limited to:
107	a. Providing for a Medicaid and public assistance fraud
108	prosecutor in the Office of the Statewide Prosecutor.
109	b. Providing assistance to state attorneys for support
110	services or equipment, or for the hiring of assistant state
111	attorneys, as needed, to prosecute Medicaid and public
112	assistance fraud cases.
113	c. Providing assistance to judges for support services or
114	for the hiring of senior judges, as needed, so that Medicaid and
115	public assistance fraud cases can be heard expeditiously.
116	(b) The strike force shall receive periodic reports from
117	state agencies, law enforcement officers, investigators,
118	prosecutors, and coordinating teams regarding Medicaid and
119	public assistance criminal and civil investigations. Such
120	reports may include discussions regarding significant factors
121	and trends relevant to a statewide Medicaid and public
122	assistance fraud strategy.
123	(7) REPORTS.—The strike force shall annually prepare and
124	submit a report on its activities and recommendations, by
125	October 1, to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the
126	House of Representatives, the Governor, and the chairs of the
127	House of Representatives and Senate committees that have
128	substantive jurisdiction over Medicaid and public assistance

129	fraud.

130	Section 3. Section 624.352, Florida Statutes, is created to

132	624.352 Interagency agreements to detect and deter Medicaid
133	and public assistance fraud
134	(1) The Chief Financial Officer shall prepare model
135	interagency agreements for the coordination of prevention,
136	investigation, and prosecution of Medicaid and public assistance
137	fraud to be known as "Strike Force" agreements. Parties to such
138	agreements may include any agency that is headed by a Cabinet
139	officer, the Governor, the
