10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
11	
12	Section 1. Existing single-family docks constructed prior
13	to June 1, 2009, that are located within Nassau County in the
14	Nassau River-St. Johns River Marshes Aquatic Preserve shall:
15	(1) Be exempt from the need to obtain a permit under part
16	IV of chapter 373, Florida Statutes, for the existing dock or
17	for modifications to the existing dock necessary to meet the
18	conditions for applying for a letter of consent pursuant to this
19	act.
20	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 258, Florida
21	Statutes, and rule 18-20, Florida Administrative Code, be
22	allowed to retain a terminal platform, as defined in rule 18-
23	20.003(67), Florida Administrative Code, with a cumulative total
24	deck and roof area not to exceed 800 square feet, provided that
25	by December 31, 2010, the owner of the riparian parcel
26	associated with the dock conforms the dock to meet the terminal
27	platform size requirement, if necessary, and applies for a
28	letter of consent to use sovereignty submerged lands from the

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29 Department of Environmental Protection acting on behalf of the 30 Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund. A letter of consent shall be issued once applicable criteria of 31 this act are met and the owner shall record the original letter 32 33 of consent in the Nassau County Official Records Book to run 34 with the upland parcel. 35 (3) Be individually removed or brought into full 36 compliance with the current rules of the board if more than 50 37 percent of such a single-family dock falls into a state of disrepair or is destroyed as a result of any natural or manmade 38 39 force. This subsection shall not be construed to prevent routine 40 repair or maintenance of the existing structure. 41 Section 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed to 42 prevent the Department of Environmental Protection from taking 43 enforcement action against the owner of the riparian parcel 44 associated with a dock that does not meet the criteria of 45 section 1 after December 31, 2010.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
