An act relating to the breast cancer early detection and treatment referral program; amending s. 381.932, F.S.; revising certain criteria of the program by requiring that the public education and outreach initiative and professional education programs use guidelines currently employed by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention rather than the United States Preventive Services Task Force; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (3) of section 381.932, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

381.932 Breast cancer early detection and treatment

- (3) The program shall include, but not be limited to, the:
- (a) Establishment of a public education and outreach initiative to publicize breast cancer early detection services, the benefits of early detection of breast cancer, and the recommended frequency for receiving screening services, including clinical breast examinations and mammography guidelines currently employed by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention established by the United States Preventive Services Task Force.
- (b) Development of professional education programs that include information regarding the benefits of the early detection of breast cancer and the recommended frequency for

receiving a mammogram, as recommended in the most current breast cancer screening guidelines currently employed by the United

States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention established by the United States Preventive Services Task Force.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
