Section 1. Section 480.054, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 480.054 Documents required for identification for presentation to law enforcement officer while offering or providing massage services.-
- (1) Each person who provides or offers to provide massage services for compensation, or on behalf of a massage establishment or for any business, shall possess a wallet-size

identification license card or wall license card issued in his or her name by the Department of Health pursuant to s. 456.013 and one of the following documents issued in his or her name:

- (a) A current driver's license;
- (b) An identification card issued by the state;
- (c) A valid passport issued by the Department of State of the United States;
  - (d) A valid I-551 permanent residence card; or
  - (e) A valid employment authorization document.
- (2) Upon request by a law enforcement officer, a person who provides or offers to provide massage services for compensation, or on behalf of a massage establishment or for any business, shall present to the law enforcement officer the wallet-size identification license card or wall license card issued in his or her name by the Department of Health pursuant to s. 456.013 and one of the following documents issued in his or her name:
  - (a) A current driver's license;
  - (b) An identification card issued by the state;
- (c) A valid passport issued by the Department of State of the United States;
  - (d) A valid I-551 permanent residence card; or
  - (e) A valid employment authorization document.
- (3) A person may not offer or provide massage services for compensation, or on behalf of a massage establishment or for any business, without being in possession of a valid wallet-size identification license card or wall license card issued in his or her name by the Department of Health pursuant to s. 456.013 and one of the following documents issued in his or her name:
  - (a) A current driver's license;

- (b) An identification card issued by a state;
- (c) A valid passport issued by the Department of State of the United States;
  - (d) A valid I-551 permanent residence card; or
  - (e) A valid employment authorization document.
- (4) Any person who operates a massage establishment pursuant to s. 480.043 shall maintain valid work authorization documents on the premises for each employee who is not a United States citizen. Valid work authorization documents for an employee who is not a United States citizen include the following documents issued in the employee's name:
  - (a) A valid I-551 permanent residence card; or
  - (b) A valid employment authorization document.
- (5) Upon request by a law enforcement officer, any person who operates a massage establishment shall present valid work authorization documents on the premises for each employee who is not a United States citizen. Valid work authorization documents for an employee who is not a United States citizen include the following documents issued in the employee's name:
  - (a) A valid I-551 permanent residence card; or
  - (b) A valid employment authorization document.
- (6) A person may not operate or otherwise manage a massage establishment without maintaining valid work authorization documents on the premises for each employee who is not a United States citizen. Valid work authorization documents for an employee who is not a United States citizen include the following documents issued in the employee's name:
  - (a) A valid I-551 permanent residence card; or
  - (b) A valid employment authorization document.

- (7) A person may not use a massage establishment licensed pursuant to s. 480.043, including any place structure, building, trailer, conveyance, or any other part thereof, for the purpose of lewdness, assignation, or prostitution as defined in s. 796.07. (8) A person who violates any provision of this section commits:
  - (a) A misdemeanor of the second degree for the first violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
  - (b) A misdemeanor of the first degree for the second violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
  - (c) A felony of the third degree for the third or subsequent violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
