A bill to be entitled

An act relating to trust funds; creating the Sustainable and Renewable Energy Policy Trust Fund within the Florida Energy Office of the Department of Environmental Protection; providing for sources of funds and purposes; providing for annual carryforward of funds; providing for the future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund; providing a contingent effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) The Sustainable and Renewable Energy
Policy Trust Fund is created within the Florida Energy Office of
the Department of Environmental Protection. The trust fund shall
be administered by the head of the office or his or her
designee. Funds allocated to the trust fund include funds
received from state appropriations, federal and state grants,
and deposits consisting of the monthly systems benefits charge
collected by the electric utilities in the state from every
residential, commercial, and industrial consumer of electric
service for deposit into the trust fund. The funds in the trust
fund shall be used to support the activities of the directsupport organization of the office relating to sustainable and
renewable energy projects in this state.

(2) Notwithstanding s. 216.301, Florida Statutes, and pursuant to s. 216.351, Florida Statutes, any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year shall remain in the trust fund and shall be available for carrying out the purposes

of the trust fund.

(3) In accordance with s. 19(f)(2), Article III of the State Constitution, the trust fund shall, unless terminated sooner, be terminated on July 1, 2014. Before its scheduled termination, the trust fund shall be reviewed as provided in s. 215.3206(1) and (2), Florida Statutes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect on the same date that House Bill 29C or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
