12	Section 1. Section 295.187, Florida Statutes, is amended

16	(1) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the "Florida
17	Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Opportunity Act."
18	(2) INTENTIt is the intent of the Legislature to rectify
19	the economic disadvantage of service-disabled veterans, who are
20	statistically the least likely to be self-employed when compared
21	to the veteran population as a whole and who have made
22	extraordinary sacrifices on behalf of the nation, the state, and
23	the public, by providing opportunities for service-disabled
24	veteran business enterprises as set forth in this section. The
25	Legislature also intends to recognize wartime veterans for their
26	sacrifices as set forth in this section.
27	(3) DEFINITIONSFor the purpose of this section, the
28	term:

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29 "Certified service-disabled veteran business (a) 30 enterprise" means a business that has been certified by the 31 Department of Management Services to be a service-disabled 32 veteran business enterprise as defined in paragraph (c). 33 "Service-disabled veteran" means a veteran who is a (b) 34 permanent Florida resident with a service-connected disability 35 as determined by the United States Department of Veterans 36 Affairs or who has been terminated from military service by 37 reason of disability by the United States Department of Defense. "Service-disabled Veteran business enterprise" means 38 (C) 39 an independently owned and operated business that: Employs 200 or fewer permanent full-time employees; 40 1. Together with its affiliates has a net worth of \$5 2. 41 42 million or less or, if a sole proprietorship, has a net worth of \$5 million or less including both personal and business 43 44 investments; Is organized to engage in commercial transactions; 45 3. 4. Is domiciled in this state; 46 47 5. Is at least 51 percent owned by one or more wartime veterans or service-disabled veterans; and 48 49 6. The management and daily business operations of which 50 are controlled by one or more wartime veterans or service-51 disabled veterans or, for a service-disabled veteran having with 52 a permanent and total disability, by the spouse or permanent 53 caregiver of the veteran. "Wartime veteran" means a person who served in the 54 (d) 55 United States military in a combat zone and was honorably 56 discharged. Page 2 of 6

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(4) VENDOR PREFERENCE.-

(a) A state agency, when considering two or more bids, 58 proposals, or replies for the procurement of commodities or 59 contractual services, at least one of which is from a certified 60 61 service-disabled veteran business enterprise, which that are 62 equal with respect to all relevant considerations, including 63 price, quality, and service, shall award such procurement or 64 contract to the certified service-disabled veteran business 65 enterprise.

(b) Notwithstanding s. 287.057(11), if a service-disabled 66 veteran business enterprise entitled to the vendor preference 67 68 under this section and one or more businesses entitled to this preference or another vendor preference provided by law submit 69 70 bids, proposals, or replies for procurement of commodities or 71 contractual services which that are equal with respect to all 72 relevant considerations, including price, quality, and service, 73 then the state agency shall award the procurement or contract to 74 the business having the smallest net worth.

75 (c) Political subdivisions of the state are encouraged to 76 offer a similar consideration to businesses certified under this 77 section.

(5) CERTIFICATION PROCEDURE.-

79 (a) The application for certification as a service80 disabled veteran business enterprise must, at a minimum,
81 include:

The name of the business enterprise applying for
 certification and the name of the service-disabled veteran
 submitting the application on behalf of the business enterprise.

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2. The names of all owners of the business enterprise,
including owners who are <u>wartime veterans</u>, service-disabled
veterans, and owners who are not <u>a wartime veteran or a</u> servicedisabled <u>veteran</u> <del>veterans</del>, and the percentage of ownership
interest held by each owner.

90 3. The names of all persons involved in both the 91 management and daily operations of the business, including the 92 spouse or permanent caregiver of a veteran <u>who has</u> <del>with</del> a 93 permanent and total disability.

94 4. The service-connected disability rating of all persons
95 listed under subparagraphs 1., 2., and 3., as applicable, with
96 supporting documentation from the United States Department of
97 Veterans Affairs or the United States Department of Defense.

98 <u>5. Documentation of the wartime service of all persons</u> 99 <u>listed under subparagraphs 1., 2., and 3., as applicable, from</u> 100 <u>the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or the United</u> 101 States Department of Defense.

6.5. The number of permanent full-time employees.

7.6. The location of the business headquarters.

104 <u>8.7</u>. The total net worth of the business enterprise and 105 its affiliates. In the case of a sole proprietorship, the net 106 worth includes personal and business investments.

107 (b) To maintain certification, a service-disabled veteran
108 business enterprise shall renew its certification biennially.

(c) The provisions of Chapter 120, relating to application, denial, and revocation procedures, applies shall apply to certifications under this section.

(d) A certified service-disabled veteran business

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enterprise must notify the Department of Management Services within 30 business days after any event that may significantly affect the certification of the business, including, but not limited to, a change in ownership or change in management and daily business operations.

The certification of a service-disabled veteran 118 (e) 119 business enterprise shall be revoked for 12 months if the 120 Department of Management Services determines that the business 121 enterprise violated paragraph (d). An owner of a certified 122 service-disabled veteran business enterprise whose certification 123 is revoked may is not permitted to reapply for certification 124 under this section as an owner of any business enterprise during 125 the 12-month revocation period.

During the 12-month revocation period, a service disabled veteran business enterprise whose certification has
 been revoked may bid on state contracts but is not eligible for
 any preference available under this section.

130 2. A service-disabled veteran business enterprise whose
131 certification has been revoked may apply for certification at
132 the conclusion of the 12-month revocation period by complying
133 with requirements applicable to initial certifications.

134 (6) DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS.—The135 department shall:

(a) Assist the Department of Management Services in
establishing a certification procedure, which shall be reviewed
biennially and updated as necessary.

(b) Identify eligible service-disabled veteran business
 enterprises by any electronic means, including electronic mail
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141 or Internet website, or by any other reasonable means.

(c) Encourage and assist eligible service-disabled veteran
business enterprises to apply for certification under this
section.

(d) Provide information regarding services that are
available from the Office of Veterans' Business Outreach of the
Florida Small Business Development Center to service-disabled
veteran business enterprises.

149 (7) DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT SERVICES.—The 150 department shall:

(a) With assistance from the Department of Veterans'
Affairs, establish a certification procedure, which shall be
reviewed biennially and updated as necessary.

(b) Grant, deny, or revoke the certification of a service disabled veteran business enterprise under this section.

(c) Maintain an electronic directory of certified service disabled veteran business enterprises for use by the state,
 political subdivisions of the state, and the public.

(8) REPORT.-The Small Business Development Center shall
 include in its report required by s. 288.705 the percentage of
 certified service-disabled veteran business enterprises using
 the statewide contracts register.

(9) RULES.-The Department of Veterans' Affairs and the
Department of Management Services, as appropriate, may adopt
rules as necessary to administer this section.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.

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
