An act relating to obscenity; amending s. 847.001, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "sexual conduct" for purposes of provisions relating to obscenity to include certain forms of simulated conduct; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (16) of section 847.001, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

847.001 Definitions.—As used in this chapter, the term:

(16) "Sexual conduct" means actual or simulated sexual intercourse, deviate sexual intercourse, sexual bestiality, masturbation, or sadomasochistic abuse; actual or simulated lewd exhibition of the genitals; actual or simulated physical contact with a person's clothed or unclothed genitals, pubic area, buttocks, or, if such person is a female, breast with the intent to arouse or gratify the sexual desire of either party; or any actual or simulated act or conduct which constitutes sexual battery or simulates that sexual battery is being or will be committed. A mother's breastfeeding of her baby does not under any circumstance constitute "sexual conduct."

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
