57 with acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and means used to 58 control the spread of acquired immune deficiency syndrome. The 59 instruction shall be appropriate for the grade and age of the 60 student and shall reflect current theory, knowledge, and 61 practice regarding acquired immune deficiency syndrome and its 62 prevention.

63 (2) Throughout instruction in acquired immune deficiency
64 syndrome, sexually transmitted diseases, or health education
65 which, when such instruction and course material contains
66 instruction in human sexuality. If, a school provides
67 instruction pursuant to this subsection, the school shall:

(a) Teach abstinence from sexual activity outside of
 marriage as the expected standard for all school-age students
 while teaching the benefits of monogamous heterosexual marriage.

71 <u>(a) (b)</u> Emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity is a 72 certain way to avoid <u>unintended</u> out-of-wedlock pregnancy, 73 sexually transmitted diseases, including acquired immune 74 deficiency syndrome, and other associated health problems.

75 (b) (c) Teach that each student has the power to control 76 personal behavior and encourage students to base actions on 77 reasoning, self-esteem, and respect for others.

78 <u>(c) (d)</u> Provide instruction and material that is <u>medically</u> 79 <u>and factually accurate and</u> appropriate for the grade and age of 80 the student.

81 (3) Any student whose parent makes written request to the 82 school principal shall be exempted from the teaching of human 83 sexuality or sexually transmitted diseases. A student so 84 exempted may not be penalized by reason of that exemption.
