48	and who are no longer eligible for exceptional student education
49	funding due to age or who have graduated from high school the
50	opportunity to obtain a postsecondary education on a college
51	campus setting. The school shall be a component of the delivery
52	of public education within Florida's K-20 education system and
53	shall be funded through the Department of Education. The school
54	shall provide educational programs and support services
55	appropriate to meet the educational and related evaluation and
56	counseling needs of students who have developmental disabilities
57	and who meet the enrollment criteria. Unless otherwise provided
58	by law, the school shall comply with all laws and rules

83	(4) BOARD OF TRUSTEES.—
