Senate Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States,
urging Congress to ban the sale, distribution, and
possession of methylenedioxypropylvalerone (MDPV).

WHEREAS, methylenedioxypropylvalerone (MDPV) is a
psychoactive drug with stimulant properties and has no history
of FDA-approved medical use, and

WHEREAS, MDPV acts as a stimulant and has been reported to
have amphetamine-like or cocaine-type effects, which include
physical rapid heartbeat, vasoconstriction, sweating, euphoria,
anxiety, agitation, perception of a diminished requirement for
food and sleep, and increases in alertness, awareness,
wakefulness, arousal, and blood pressure and

WHEREAS, Florida's Attorney General has issued an emergency
order banning the sale of substances containing MDPV in the
state for a limited period, and

WHEREAS, federal action is needed to control MDPV and keep
it from entering this state from elsewhere, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States is urged to ban the
sale, distribution, and possession of methylenedioxypropylvalerone
(MDPV).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be
dispatched to the President of the United States, to the
President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the
United States House of Representatives, and to each member of
