6	brain tumor each year and 150,000 more are diagnosed with a
7	metastatic brain tumor that results from cancer spreading from
8	another part of the body to the brain, and
9	WHEREAS, brain tumors are the leading cause of death from
10	solid tumors in children under the age of 20 and are the third
11	leading cause of death from cancer in young adults between the
12	ages of 20 and 39, and
13	WHEREAS, brain tumors may be malignant or benign, but can
14	be life-threatening in either case, and
15	WHEREAS, 612,000 Americans have been diagnosed and are
16	living with a brain tumor, and
17	WHEREAS, the treatment of brain tumors is complicated by
18	the fact that more than 120 different types of brain tumors
19	exist, and
20	WHEREAS, the treatment of brain tumors presents significant
21	challenges because of their location, the difficulty of
22	delivering treatment across the blood-brain barrier and the
23	serious edema that results when the blood-brain barrier is
24	disrupted, and the obstacles to complete surgical removal of
25	tumors, and
26	WHEREAS, brain tumors have been described as a disease that
27	affects the essence of "self," and
28	WHEREAS, brain tumor research is supported by a number of
29	private nonprofit research foundations and by institutes at the
