

1 A bill to be entitled
 2 An act relating to restaurants licensed to sell wine on
 3 the premises; amending s. 564.09, F.S.; revising
 4 requirements for a restaurant patron to remove a resealed
 5 wine container from a restaurant for off-premises
 6 consumption; providing an effective date.

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 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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 10 Section 1. Section 564.09, Florida Statutes, is amended to
 11 read:

12 564.09 Restaurants; off-premises consumption of wine.—
 13 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a restaurant
 14 licensed to sell wine on the premises may permit a patron to
 15 remove one unsealed bottle of wine for consumption off the
 16 premises if the patron has purchased a ~~full-course~~ meal
 17 ~~consisting of a salad or vegetable, entree, a beverage, and~~
 18 ~~bread~~ and consumed a portion of the bottle of wine with such
 19 meal ~~on the restaurant premises~~. A partially consumed bottle of
 20 wine that is to be removed from the premises must be securely
 21 resealed by the licensee or its employees before removal from
 22 the premises. The partially consumed bottle of wine shall be
 23 placed in a bag or other container that is secured in such a
 24 manner that it is visibly apparent if the container has been
 25 subsequently opened or tampered with, and a dated receipt for
 26 the bottle of wine and ~~full-course~~ meal shall be provided by the
 27 licensee and attached to the container. If transported in a
 28 motor vehicle, the container with the resealed bottle of wine

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29 | must be placed in a locked glove compartment, a locked trunk, or
30 | the area behind the last upright seat of a motor vehicle that is
31 | not equipped with a trunk.

32 | Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
