A resolution recognizing the 75-year partnership between the City of Lakeland and the Detroit Tigers.

WHEREAS, with the exception of a three-year interruption during World War II, the Detroit Tigers have conducted their spring training in the City of Lakeland since 1934, and

WHEREAS, as Spring 2011 marked the team's 75 th season of training in the city, the Detroit Tigers and the City of Lakeland established the longest-lasting partnership between a franchise and a host city in the history of Major League Baseball, and

WHEREAS, during this time, Lakeland has hosted 14 members of the Major League Baseball Hall of Fame as they prepared for their upcoming seasons, and

WHEREAS, built on the former site of the Lodwick School of Aeronautics, a World War II flight school, Joker Marchant Stadium and the Tiger Town training complex are known worldwide as a first-class establishment that, through both preseason and offseason training programs, prepares current team members for upcoming competition and aids injured players in maintaining their skills, and

WHEREAS, since 2000, over one million baseball fans have visited Joker Marchant Stadium, ranking the Detroit Tigers and the City of Lakeland among the Florida Grapefruit League's leaders in annual attendance, NOW, THEREFORE,
