29 indicate on, or otherwise track the voter's precinct for each 30 early voted ballot. In order for a branch office to be used for 31 early voting, it shall be a permanent facility of the supervisor 32 and shall have been designated and used as such for at least 1 33 year prior to the election. The supervisor may also designate 34 any city hall or permanent public library facility as Early 35 voting sites; however, if so designated, the sites must be 36 geographically located so as to provide all voters in the county 37 an equal opportunity to cast a ballot, insofar as is 38 practicable. Each county shall operate the same total number of 39 early voting sites that it used for the 2008 general election, 40 or one early voting site plus one additional early voting site 41 for every complete set of 65,000 registered voters in the county 42 as of July 1 of each general election year, whichever is 43 greater. The results or tabulation of votes cast during early 44 voting may not be made before the close of the polls on election day. Results shall be reported by precinct. 45

Early voting shall begin on the 15th day before an 46 (d) 47 election and end on the 2nd day before an election. For purposes of a special election held pursuant to s. 100.101, early voting 48 49 shall begin on the 8th day before an election and end on the 2nd 50 day before an election. Early voting shall be provided for 12 & 51 hours per weekday and 12 8 hours in the aggregate each weekend at each site during the applicable periods. Early voting sites 52 shall open no sooner than 7 a.m. and close no later than 7 p.m. 53 54 on each applicable day.
