The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 22 security numbers, and photographs of active or former law 23 enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional 24 probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, 25 26 neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal 27 activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, and 28 Page 1 of 7

177 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, and 178 179 photographs of current and former investigators and inspectors 180 of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, the 181 names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of 182 employment of the spouses and children of such current or former investigators and inspectors, and the names and locations of 183 184 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such 185 current or former investigators and inspectors be made exempt 186 from public records requirements. The Legislature finds that the 187 release of such identifying and location information might place 188 the department's investigators and inspectors and their family 189 members in danger of physical and emotional harm from disgruntled individuals whose business or professional practice 190 191 have come under the scrutiny of investigators and inspectors of 192 the department. The Legislature further finds that the harm that 193 may result from the release of such personal identifying and location information outweighs any public benefit that may be 194 195 derived from the disclosure of the information. 196 Section 3.
