It is 202 also the finding of the Legislature that it is a public 203 necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, and 204 photographs of current and former investigators and inspectors 205 of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of 206 207 employment of the spouses and children of such current or former 208 investigators and inspectors, and the names and locations of 209 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such 210 current or former investigators and inspectors be made exempt 211 from public record requirements.
