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28 29 An act relating to public records; amending s. 943.44353, F.S.; creating a public records exemption for the electronic mail address and physical address information provided to the Department of Law Enforcement by a person requesting access to the automatic notification system of registration information regarding sexual predators and sexual offenders; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (3) is added to section 943.44353, Florida Statutes, to read:

943.44353 Automatic notification of registration information regarding sexual predators and offenders.—

- (3) (a) Any electronic mail address or physical address information provided to the department by a person, other than a sexual predator and sexual offender, who requests access to the automatic notification system is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This exemption applies to any electronic mail address or physical address information held by the department before, on, or after July 1, 2012.
- (b) This subsection is subject to the Open Government
 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand

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repealed on October 2, 2017, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to exempt from public records requirements the electronic mail address and physical address information furnished to the Department of Law Enforcement by persons requesting access to the automatic notification system of registration information regarding sexual predators and sexual offenders. A public records exemption for such information furnished to the department will encourage greater access to the notification system by alleviating concerns about disclosure of electronic mail and physical location information that could be used for criminal purposes. Public safety is significantly enhanced through the use of the department's notification system. For these reasons, the public records exemption provided by this act is necessary for effective and broad participation in the notification system by those seeking notification.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
