A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Palm Beach County Environmental Control Act, Palm Beach County; amending chapter 77-616, Laws of Florida, as amended; defining the term "repeat violation"; removing a requirement that the Environmental Control Officer be a county employee; increasing civil fines in circuit court actions; increasing civil penalties; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Sections 6, 15, and 17 of chapter 77-616, Laws of Florida, as amended by chapters 90-432 and 79-544, Laws of Florida, are amended, and subsection (k) is added to section 3 of that chapter, to read:

17 Section 3. Definitions.—The following words as used in this act shall have the following meanings: 18

"Repeat violation" means a violation of a county or state code, ordinance, statute, or rule enacted pursuant to chapter 59-1698, Laws of Florida, as amended, by a person who has been previously found through a Hearing Board or Circuit Court process to have violated or who has admitted to violating the same provision within 5 years before the violation, notwithstanding whether the violations occurred at different locations.

Section 6. Environmental Control Officer; Appointment.-The Board shall appoint an Environmental Control Officer. In so

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Health Director. The Board shall select the said Environmental Control Officer from among those applicants who are either lawyers or engineers duly licensed to practice in the state. The Board shall give due consideration to the qualifications and experience of each said applicant in the field of environmental control. The Environmental Control Officer, following appointment by the Board, shall be an employee of Palm Beach County.

Section 15. Circuit Court Actions. The Environmental Control Officer may institute proceedings in the Circuit Court for Palm Beach County to abate and prosecute violations of this act or enforce orders of the Hearing Board. For violations of this act and any ordinances, rules, and regulations adopted

Control Officer may institute proceedings in the Circuit Court for Palm Beach County to abate and prosecute violations of this act or enforce orders of the Hearing Board. For violations of this act and any ordinances, rules, and regulations adopted pursuant hereto, such relief may include both temporary and permanent injunctions and civil fines up to \$500 \$500.00 per day for violations. For violations of chapter 59-1698, Laws of Florida, as amended, and any rules and regulations adopted thereto, such relief may include both temporary and permanent injunctions and civil fines not to exceed \$1,000 per day per violation for a first violation, \$5,000 per day per violation for a repeat violation, and \$15,000 per violation if the Hearing Board or Circuit Court finds the violation to be irreparable or irreversible in nature. Any proceedings initiated under this section shall be brought for and in the name of Palm Beach County.

Section 17. Violations; Civil Penalties.—For violations of the provisions of the act and any ordinances, rules, and

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regulations adopted pursuant hereto, any person found by the Hearing Board or Circuit Court to be or have been in violation of such provisions this act may have imposed against him a civil penalty not to exceed \$500 five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each day of violation. For violations of chapter 59-1698, Laws of Florida, as amended, and any rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto, any person found by the Hearing Board or Circuit Court to have committed such a violation may have imposed against him or her a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000 per day per violation for a first violation, \$5,000 per day per violation for a repeat violation, and \$15,000 per violation if the Hearing Board or Circuit Court finds the violation to be irreparable or irreversible in nature. In determining the amount of such civil penalty, the Hearing Board or Circuit Court shall consider the nature, duration, and environmental impact of such violation. The Hearing Board or Court shall incorporate the amount of the penalty imposed on its final decision and order finding such person in violation. All civil penalties collected under this section shall be paid into the general fund of Palm Beach County.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
