Prior capital felony points: If the offender has one or more 406 407 prior capital felonies in the offender's criminal record, points 408 shall be added to the subtotal sentence points of the offender equal to twice the number of points the offender receives for 409 410 the primary offense and any additional offense. A prior capital felony in the offender's criminal record is a previous capital 411 412 felony offense for which the offender has entered a plea of nolo 413 contendere or quilty or has been found quilty; or a felony in 414 another jurisdiction which is a capital felony in that 415 jurisdiction, or would be a capital felony if the offense were committed in this state. 416

418 Possession of a firearm, semiautomatic firearm, or machine gun: 419 If the offender is convicted of committing or attempting to 420 commit any felony other than those enumerated in s. 775.087(2) 421 while having in his or her possession: a firearm as defined in 422 s. 790.001(6), an additional eighteen (18) sentence points are 423 assessed; or if the offender is convicted of committing or 424 attempting to commit any felony other than those enumerated in

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425 s. 775.087(3) while having in his or her possession a 426 semiautomatic firearm as defined in s. 775.087(3) or a machine 427 gun as defined in s. 790.001(9), an additional twenty-five (25) 428 sentence points are assessed.

430 Sentencing multipliers:

432 Drug trafficking: If the primary offense is drug trafficking 433 under s. 893.135, the subtotal sentence points are multiplied, 434 at the discretion of the court, for a level 7 or level 8 435 offense, by 1.5. The state attorney may move the sentencing 436 court to reduce or suspend the sentence of a person convicted of 437 a level 7 or level 8 offense, if the offender provides 438 substantial assistance as described in s. 893.135(4).

440 Law enforcement protection: If the primary offense is a 441 violation of the Law Enforcement Protection Act under s. 442 775.0823(2), (3), or (4), the subtotal sentence points are 443 multiplied by 2.5. If the primary offense is a violation of s. 775.0823(5), (6), (7), (8), or (9), the subtotal sentence points 444 445 are multiplied by 2.0. If the primary offense is a violation of 446 s. 784.07(3) or s. 775.0875(1), or of the Law Enforcement 447 Protection Act under s. 775.0823(10) or (11), the subtotal 448 sentence points are multiplied by 1.5.

450 Grand theft of a motor vehicle: If the primary offense is grand 451 theft of the third degree involving a motor vehicle and in the 452 offender's prior record, there are three or more grand thefts of

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453 the third degree involving a motor vehicle, the subtotal 454 sentence points are multiplied by 1.5. 455 456 Offense related to a criminal gang: If the offender is convicted 457 of the primary offense and committed that offense for the 458 purpose of benefiting, promoting, or furthering the interests of 459 a criminal gang as defined in s. 874.03 prohibited under s. 460 874.04, the subtotal sentence points are multiplied by 1.5. If 461 applying the multiplier results in the lowest permissible sentence exceeding the statutory maximum sentence for the 462 463 primary offense under chapter 775, the court may not apply the 464 multiplier and must sentence the defendant to the statutory 465 maximum sentence. 466 467 Domestic violence in the presence of a child: If the offender is 468 convicted of the primary offense and the primary offense is a 469 crime of domestic violence, as defined in s. 741.28, which was 470 committed in the presence of a child under 16 years of age who 471 is a family or household member as defined in s. 741.28(3) with the victim or perpetrator, the subtotal sentence points are 472 473 multiplied by 1.5.
