House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States,
urging Congress to propose an amendment to the
Constitution of the United States that requires a cap
on federal spending as a percentage of gross domestic
product.

WHEREAS, the current national debt is over \$15 trillion, a
cost of approximately \$50,000 for each man, woman, and child in
the United States, and is growing at an alarming rate, and

WHEREAS, the national debt as a percentage of gross
domestic product (GDP) is at a historic high and projected to
continue rising if action to constrain spending is not taken,
and

WHEREAS, the United States does not have a revenue problem,
it has a spending problem, and

WHEREAS, every dollar the Federal Government takes out of
the American economy is a dollar that cannot be used by American
companies and entrepreneurs to create jobs and economic growth,
and

WHEREAS, the nation's current budget crisis, if continued,
will burden future generations with massive amounts of debt, and

WHEREAS, it is prudent to establish a cap to align federal
spending with average revenues at 20 percent of GDP and, thus,
reduce the national debt and protect America's financial future,
NOW, THEREFORE,
