The agency, in consultation with the office, 36 may contract with an actuary who is a member of the American 37 Academy of Actuaries and other persons who have an extensive 38 background in health insurance for the purpose of assisting the 39 agency in evaluating the medical necessity, efficacy, and costs 40 of such coverage.
